COUNTRY NEWS.

Cork, October 19 On Tuesday last his Majesty's ship Phæbe, Captain Barlow, brought into Cove a French ship privateer, of 16 guns and 130 men, which she captured about 5 days before in lat. 49. long. 20.

The Melampus Captain Moore, sailed on a cruize on Tuesday last.

Two men have lately been apprehended by the Muskerry yeomanry, in the neighbourhood of Macromp, on suspicion of being concerned in the murder of Mr. Hutchinson.

LIMERICK, — OCTOBER 23.

The instructions for which the British Commander in Chief waits, must be interpreted as a notice for recal, the Dutch people being so generally under the influence or dominion of France, that while a part may be unwilling there are others afraid or unable to shake off the connexion. Whatever has prevented the expected co-operation of the inhabitants of that country with the allied armies, their inertness was fatal to the project; Great Britain, however, has performed all that could be effected in order to furnish them with an opportunity of returning to their former situation, but was not seconded to the necessary extent. In this enterprise there is one circumstance which serves to counterbalance to a certain degree its failure in other objects, namely, the possession of their Navy, which important event resulted from the undertaking.

On Monday night last, a number of armed Villains, placed Cars and Stakes at the end of the Curragh of Kildare, in order to stop the Mail-Coach from hence to Dublin; while the Military Guard which was escorting the Coach, were removing those impediments, they were fired on by the Rebels, who had secreted themselves behind ditches; the escort and passengers returned the fire, and, it is said, killed three of the assailants; — one of the Coach Horses was shot. The Coach arrived safe in Dublin yesterday.
