

cession of the latter place.—The cargo of Rome was delivered up to Gen. Bourcard, commanding the Neapolitan troops. The French garrison marched out with all the honours of war, and went to Civita Vecchia, where it was to be embarked for France.

Orders were yesterday issued from the Admiralty for l'Espion frigate to be fitted in readiness for sea, as a cartel to convey the Dutch and French prisoners from this country.

The 3d Regiment of Guards, commanded by Colonel Grosvenor, and the 9th Regiment commanded by Colonel Gower, were landed at Yarmouth on Monday night and yesterday morning; the 3d Regiment of Guards marched for Norwich.

Measures have been taken, in the Island of Bornholm, for landing and nursing the sick from the English and Russian ships cruising in the Baltic.

The following officers are arrived at Yarmouth from the Helder in the Princess Royal Packet:—Colonels Bulkley, Tinling, and Vade; Captains Collier, Mackenzie, Bowen, and Shepherd; and Lieut. Harris with the Russian Gen. Emm.

There is at present in the Middlesex Hospital a young and delicate female, who calls herself Miss T—l—t, and who is said to be related to some families of distinction: her story is very singular.—At an early period of her life, having been deprived, by the villainy of a trustee, of a sum of money, bequeathed her by a deceased relative of high rank, she followed the fortunes of a young naval officer, to whom she was attached, and personated a common sailor before the mast, during a cruize in the North Seas.—In consequence of a lover's quarrel, she quitted her ship, and assumed for a time the military character; but her passion for the sea prevailing, she returned to her favourite element, did good service, and received a severe wound on board Earl St. Vincent's ship on the glorious 14th of February, and again bled in the cause of her country in the engagement off Camperdown.—On this last occasion her knee was shattered, and an amputation is likely to ensue. This spirited female, we understand, received a pension of 20l. from an illustrious Lady, which is about to be doubled.

A PROCLAMATION.
CORNWALLIS.

WHEREAS We have received Information, that the Lord Chancellor's Steward, of the Name of ALLEN, was, on Thursday Night last, most inhumanly Murdered by a number of Persons, who are supposed to have entered by a Ladder into his Bed-Chamber, at his Lordship's House, at Mount-Shannon, in the County of the City of Limerick, from whence the Perpetrators of this horrid Crime dragged him, the said ALLEN, nearly a Quarter of a Mile to the River Mulcaire, where the Body of the deceased was afterwards found, with many marks of Violence thereon.

Now We the Lord Lieutenant and Council of Ireland, being fully determined, as far as in Us lies, to bring the Persons concerned in the said Murder to speedy and condign Punishment, do hereby publish and declare, that if any Person shall, on or before the First Day of March next, discover or apprehend any Person or Persons concerned in the said Murder, the Person or Persons so discovering and causing the Person or Persons concerned in said Murder to be apprehended, shall receive as a Reward the Sum of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS for each and every of the first three Persons who shall be so discovered, apprehended, and prosecuted to Conviction for the said Offence herein before-mentioned.

AND We do hereby further publish and declare, that if any Person concerned in the said Offence shall discover any of his Accomplices concerned therein, so as such Accomplice or Accomplices shall be apprehended and prosecuted to Conviction for said Offence, such Person or Persons so discovering, shall, over and above the said Reward, receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon for the said Offence, for which he shall so discover and prosecute as aforesaid.

AND We do hereby strictly charge and command all Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, and all other His Majesty's loving Subjects, to be aiding and assisting in apprehending and prosecuting to Conviction the Persons concerned in the said Offence.
