

London, Nov. 5. At a Common Council
held on the 2d inst. Alderman William Walker
elected Mayor of this City, and Maurice
Fox and Alexander Major, Esqrs. Sheriffs of
City and County for the ensuing year.

It must give satisfaction to those who suffer pre-
inconvenience from the prevalent passion for
hoarding specie, to hear that those who have re-
tained the current silver out of circulation are likely
to suffer severely for their avarice. We learn
it is intended immediately to put into circula-
tion the dollars lately taken in the Spanish fri-
ars, at such a rate of currency as shall at once
prevent the temptation of either melting down,
counterfeiting them; the present silver is to
be then cried down, so that those who have
hoarded it will find themselves immediate losers
from 50 to 75 per cent.; an average which,
considering the decrease of weight in the sterling
money, and the immense proportion of bad, will
appear by no means improbable.

On Tuesday night last, a Cow, the property
of Mr. Edw. Keys, was houghed on the Lands
of Abington, in this County.

Wednesday last, Brigadier General Meyrick,
died in Ennis, and on Thursday he inspected
the Royal Longford Militia near Clare-Castle.

On the same day, 56 fine young fellows, from the
County Militia, quartered at Guernsey,
and the 54th Regiment at Roscrea, who
volunteered to serve in any part of his Majesty's
armies.

Yesterday, at an adjournment of the Quarter-
sessions, the following persons were tried under
the Insurrection Act, for having met at the house
of James Condon, near Groody Turnpike, (as
mentioned in a former Paper) viz. Patrick Col-
lins, John Brien, Robert Mullins, Mich. Cross,
Patrick M'Daniel, Mich. Gold, Cornelius Toohy,
James Brien, Patrick Kerby, Mau. Fitz Gerald,
Fitz Gerald, and Thomas Turner.—The

persons were acquitted, but obliged to give
security for their future good behaviour; Condon
found Guilty—sentence not made known.

Committed yesterday, to the County Gaol, by
Justice Smithwick, Esq; Hugh Sweeney, sen-
ior, and Hugh Sweeney, of Doon, co.
Limerick, charged with being United Irishmen,
having assisted at the whipping of several
persons.—They were apprehended by a party
of the Elgin Fencibles, at present quartered at
Cahill-White, under the command of Captain
Condon.

On the same day, John Waters, Porter to the Right
Hon. the Earl of Clare, at Mount-Shannon, was
committed to Gaol by Hugh Dillon Maffy, Esq;
on suspicion of being concerned in the late hor-
rid murder of Mr. Allen.

ton, put into this harbour yesterday, in distress.
