Extract from a Pamphlet lately published, and mitted 'Impartial Relation of the Military opeations which took place in Ireland, in confemence of the landing of a body of French troops inder General Humbert, in August, 1798.' by n Officer \* who served in the Corps, under the ommand of his Excellency Marquis Cornwallis, "Colonel Vereker having received informaion that a detachment of the enemy was at Coony, and intended from thence to march round by Drumchare, to support the attack to be made ipon Sligo, by Ballifodare, and under the imression that the main body of the enemy had emained in Castlebar, marched from Sligo with bout 270 men of the Limerick City Militia, 30 T the 24th Dragoons, and two Curricle guns, hich, from the information he had received, he hought a force equal to the attack of the enemy. The engagement took place about a quarrer of mile to the northward of Coloony, and was varmly maintained for the space of an hour. then the French, by their great superiority of umbers, were enabled to ontflank, and to force lolonel Vereker's right, and obliged him to retear. The Officers and men of the Limerick lity Regiment, behaved most gallantly in the acon, and fuffered confiderably. Captain Crips, eir Adjutant, was killed +-Colonel Vereker, le Lieutenant-Colonel, the Major, and two balterns I were wounded; two Captains and vo Subalterns taken prisoners. Had the enemy ten opposed with equal firmness by some of the orps at Castlebar, he would probably never ive reached Coloony."
