Mooney, Dornan, Gore, and Malone, four of the robbers who stopped and pillaged the post from Philipstown to Dublin last month, were dentenced by a Court-Marcial, on Tuesday se'nnight, to be hanged.

Two of the robbers who attacked the Mail-Coach from hence to Dublin near Monastereven, as lately mentioned, were purfued and that by a patrole of the Castle Dermot Y comanry; and one of the same gang, a notorious offender, of the name of Divie, was shor by a patrole of Captain Saunders's Yeomany in the County of Wicklow; one taken prisoner by the Kilcullen Yeomanry, and another has furrendered himself to General Dundas; another of the gang, (whole name is Dwyer) known to have been dreadfully wounded in his belly, remains as yet concealed. The above delinquents were brought to justice in consequence of one of their affociates turning approver.

On Monday night last, a number of men, armed with guns and pistols, broke into the mills at Abington, in this County, in which was a fervant of Mr. Keys, the owner, whom they threatened with destruction, after which they robbed the mills of Frize and Blankets to the

value of above 401.
