they marched from Southampton to PortImouth, and there embarked immediately for Ireland.

All the avenues immediately leading to the House of Commons were crowded at an early hour yesterday by anxious multitudes, who eagerly flocked thither in expectation of hearing the intended debate on the rejection of the late pacific overtures of the French Government, --The great interest excited on this occasion continued undiminished for several hours; when at length the general anxiety was relieved by an intimation from the Speaker to the Lord Mayor, and some other Members, that the order of the day for the confideration of his Majesty's Message was, on the meeting of the House, to be postponed, on account, as we afterwards learned, of the indisposition of Mr. Pitt. - Mr. Fox had promiled to come down to deliver his fentiments on the fubject, but timely intimation of the determined postponement of the business faved him, and many other gentlemen, the trouble of an unneceffary attendance.

Letters from Babelmandel, dated lune 27. ftate, that the British squadron on that ftation, under the orders of Admiral Blankett, confifts of the Leopard and Centurion, of 50 guns each; Fox and Dædolus of 32; Albatrois and Orefles, of 18; and the Princels Charlotte Indiaman, armed en flure : all well provisioned - A floop of war which the French were carrying overland from Alexandria towards the Red Ses, had been burnt by a party of Arabs, a short distance from Suez, and 200 Republicans, who accompanied this extraordinary enterprize, had been put to the fword.

Mr. Howifon observed on the necessity of the two bodies of the Corporation having a conference previous to the Petition being formed, in order to obviate any inconvenient or embarraffing difference of opinion. He accordingly moved, that a Message, desiring a conference, be sent to the upper house, which being agreed to, the conference was permitted, and having taken

Alderman Howifon-open of the business by representing in a clear, able, and spirited manner, the necessity of the act for which the Corporation had affembled. He ftared that the refolytions heretofore entered into by the Corporation on the fabiect of Union, however they may have been supposed to operate on the conduct of the immediate representatives of the city of Dublin, could have had no necessary influence on the Legislature at large, and therefore it was absoluvely necessary to convey to the affembled Parliament the fenfe of the Corporation, However defirable the adoption of a different mode might be, this could only be done in the form of a petition, but in framing that petition, particular care thould be taken not to recognize in the most diftant manner, a right in the representative to vote away the liberties of the Constituent; on the contrary, every expression of it should go to the difavowal of that right, and Thould breath the most determined spirit in the petitioners to support the Conflication of their country in his prefent form and on its prefent balis, unmodified and unchanged. With respect to the meafure of Union in relation to the ill confequences which would flow from it to this kingdom, it had already been to amply discussed and so clearly exposed, both in and out of Parliament, that he thought it unnecessary to fay more, than that it involved as the only certain thing the furrender of their liberties, and that its promifed advantages, if advantages could flow from national fub-jugation and diffuonour, were only known by the doubt and infecurity with which they were featured. One thing only occurred to him as new on the fubject, which was, that if in a moment like the prefent, when the liberties of Ireland were at iffue, the question of Union could be narrowed into a lefs than national limit, the Corporation of Dublin, as a chartered body, must feel most feriously alarmed for the fecurity of its privileges, many of which had been derived under the present Constitution, and had no guarantee than what its existence and integrity afforded.
