WILLIAM GABBETT, Efq. in the Chair. Refolved, " That it appears to this Meeting that fince, the appointment of Daily Visitors, which took place the 9th day of latt month, confiderable improvements have taken place, and that their attention promifes to be of very great

" That the House now coatoins 48 men, 91 women, 24 boys, 21 girls-in all 184 perfons nearly half of whom are employed-the remainder, confifting of infirm, blind, lunaticks, and infants.

"That the accommodation the House now affords is very infufficient for even the number it contains; that many of them are miferably clad, the lunaticks about naked.

"That in point of room, the House is capable of containing a confiderable number more than are at prefent in it, and whom, for want of accommodation, it is impossible to admit.

" That the funds of the House are totally inadequate to enable us to Supply the quantity of bedding, clouching, and other necessaries now wanted, or even to maintain the number it now

contains through the ensuing year.
"That it is therefore highly necessary and expedient, to take immediate steps towards procuring a confiderable increase to our funds, which we can with confidence apply for, as we can with confidence state, that most material improvements have taken place in the inflitution; that the want of money is the only bar to the adoption of others, and that the public may be fully affured their bounty will not be mifapplied.

"That the following Governors-Hon, and Rev. Dean Crofbie-Rev. John Hoare-Rev. A. Hill-Rev. Wm. Hoare-Anthony Lefroy-J. M. Harvey-J. William J. Fisher, and William Gabbett, Esquires, be appointed a Committee to folicit subscriptions in aid of this Charity, and to lay before the public a just starement of its prefent fituation, and the strength of its claims to a liberal support.
