DUBLIN-JULY 3. HOUSE OF COMMONS.

Monday, June 30.
The CHAN, of the EX entered at great length into a general history of the canal navigations, for which purpose he took a review of all the considerable works of that description throughout the world, our limits will not permit us to give any more of his fpeech than the fubstance of the concluding period, that Canal Difubject to the control of the Lords of the Treafury, and both under the direction of the Lord Lieurenant, he moved the following refolutions :

Refolved. That it is the opinion of this committee, that it is highly expedient, in order to etablish a further protection for the trade of the port of Dublin, that a fum be granted by Parliament to effect the object stated in the abovemen-tioned report under such conditions and regula-

tions as Parliament fhall direct.

The refolutions were then agreed to, and Mr. Alexander directed to report them to the House. The CHAN of the EX. entered into a detail of the late loan which Mr. Luke White had relinguished. He also exculpated himself from entering into any compromife, which be understood he had been by fome rumour charged with, with Mr. White, respecting a share in the new loan, putchased by Mr. Burroughs. He also submitted to the confideration of the Committee the expediency of obtaining as a forfeiture, not only the whole of Mr. White's first deposit, but alfo compelling him to pay his next engagement, the whole amounting to 125 cool. To this the Speaker objected in point of parliamentry form, and advised reporting progress, and fitting again, which was accordingly agreed on.
