

hear that the Speaker of the House Com-
mons to whom the manufactures and agriculture
of the Kingdom are already so much indebted, is
yet circulating a wretched manufacture in the
case of Limerick, on an extensive scale.

The first export entry from hence to New
York, the capital of the United States of
America took place on Thursday, and consisted
entirely of iron, brass and hosiery, which, we
trust, will be followed by numerous others, espe-
cially as increasing rapidly in population, its de-
mands in manufactured goods will certainly in-
crease in proportion. Twelve thousand pieces of
linens were entered same day for Liverpool, and
among the important entries was a large quantity
of Geneva Goods from Rotterdam, which must
have been in consequence of some late commercial
regulations between Great Britain and Holland.
Flood and Martinon were executed this day
at the front of the New Canal, pursuant to their
sentence.

Yesterday the Lottery wheels for the draw-
ing to commence the 21st inst. were cleared out,
and lodged in the Little Theatre, Fishamble-st.
An Act for giving Compensation to all Proprietors
of Tithes, (whether Clergy or Laity), who have
suffered losses by the Insurgents during the
last year, either by the destruction of the securi-
ties or other impediments, from illegal outrages,
or the obtaining their just and lawful rights, has
now passed both Houses of Parliament. The
provisions of this Act are similar to those of the
Act of last year on a like occasion; notice to be
given previous to the first day of September next,
otherwise the claimant will be excluded from the
benefit of the law.
