On Tuefday laft a division of the homewardbound Welt-India Fleet, confilling of about fifty Tail, under convoy of the Brunswick and Retaliarion, paffed up Channel on their way to the River. On Sunday last, the remainder, confisting of about wenty fail, under convoy of the Aquilon frigate, of 32 guns, parted company for the Irish and Bristol Channels. The whole seet had a pleasant passage of 45 days; and it does not appear that any of them are milling.

By the interference of the French Commissary at Amiterdan, the paffengers on board the Dalphin Packet were fet at liberty; and allowed to proceed by land to the places of their deltination.
