## DUBLIN,-AUGUST 7.

Though the Armiflice between the Auftrians and the French may be productive of an immediate negociation for peace, and that even the preliminaries should be in a fhort time mutually ratified, yet there is every probability that Maffena will, notwithstanding, fend a strong division of his army towards the Neapolitas territories, in order to compel the Savereign of the Two Sicilies to come into fuch terms as the Confular Government may think proper to diffate, and likewife to exact the heaviest contributions and requilitions on his provinces, well knowing, that he is by no means friendly to their common wealth, both from public as well as family confiderations, and also that the French forces will meet with little opposition in their march, as he is far from reigning in the affections of his

The arrival in London of the last Hamburgh Mails has diffipated the unesfinels occasioned by their having been delayed. They bring news of some importance. The Court of Petersburgh has received a public Minister from Louis the XVIIIth, which is a complete resutation of the reports circulated in France, of the conduct of Paul towards that unfortunate Prince.

Some of the populace of Vienna, encouraged by the successes of France, presumed to insult their Sovereign and several Foreign Ministers: The culprits were arrefled, and a vigorous Pro-

clamation was immediately iffued.

Our Funds continue to fuffer a gradual depression, from the ides, that no fleps have yet been taken by his Mejefty's Minifters to open a pacific negociation with the French Republic.
