Hemburgh Gazettes of the 13th inft. one day later than the mail which arrived on Wednesday, are in town. They contain fome interesting intelligence from Italy, respecting the French having taken possession of the Legations of Bologna and Romagna; and it is reported that they are about to march 40,000 men through the States of the Church to invade the kingdom of Naples.

Nothing has been allowed to transpire respecting the contents of the diffratches which we yelterday announced to have been received from Admiral Dickfon. Of courfe many conjectures have been fet affoat, and tome have gone fo far as to infer that the ficet having been left fleering for Elfineur, fomething directly hostile might be immediately expected to take place. Any thing fo hally on our part can hardly be thought pro-bable, and the public would do well to receive with caution opinions founded on mere conjecture.

Letters from Copenhagen of the 9th infl. mention, that the day after informat \* was received there of the decention of the Danish frigate and her convoy, a Major of Engineers was fent off in great haffe to Cronenberg, the fortrels of which guards the paffage of the Sound on the Dinish fide, a short dittance from Elfineur .-The object of this journey was evidently, that that foreress might be ftrengthened, and prepared for any attempt England might make upon it, should matters proceed to the length of an open ruprure.

In the mean time every fact connected with the deflination or precedure of that fleet, is of importance to be known. On the 14th inft. we informed our readers of the prudent precautions that had been adopted for bringing home the fleer then looked for from the Baltic, before any alarm could have taken place in the ports of Deamark. Captain Weilbeach, of the Favourite, as we then flated, had no fooner received the in-Bructions fent to him than he ordered all the merchant veffels to follow him into the Categor to receive farther instructions. We announced foine days ago the lafe arrival of a great part of that convoy, and this day the rest of the fleer, under convoy of the Favourite, is also arrived.
