Weinefday, August 27, 1800. Thomas and John Carton were tried for the will murder of Charles Caffidy, of Kilmainham-wood, in this county, (Meach) on the rich of

June lait.

It appeared in evidence, that the two prisoners (brothers) went after the parade of yeomanry, to which Thomas belonged, into a public-house at K-hasinham-wood; that it being the fair-day, the house was much frequented, and (as too commonly happens in such houses) several quarrels had taken place amongst the different guetts, which the Landlord Iwore the Carlons, and particularly Thomas, had exerted themselves to make up; that towards the close of the day; a number of persons asmed Cassily came into the to drink (though not in their company) for fome time.

Thus far the evidence for the profecution and

the priloners agreed entirely.

The witnesses for the prosecution, who were part of the Cathdys' company, fore, that as they were about to leave the room, Thomas Carlon fuddenly started from his feat, druck the deceafed on the head, and drawing his bayonet flabbed him in the break, and afterwards as he was falling wounded him in the bead, and this without any previous quarrel or conversation whatever; and that the other prifoner fratched a bayonet from a yeomin (Hugh M'Kibben) who was prefent, and defired his brother to fab them all, for that "they were the boys that could work,"

On the other band, Hugh M'Kibbin Iwore that the Caffilys from the time they came in endesyoured to infult the Carlons, and that at length the deceased challenged either of them to wrettle, which they avowed, knowing that three yeomen, one of them unarmed, would have no chance in a contell with fire or fix Callidge and their friends the whole mob of the fair-hat at length the deceafed struck Thomas Carlos, who in his own defence drew his beyoner and woun-

ded him.

It was urged on the part of the profoners that they had been very active yeomen, and had as fach incurred the displeasure of the Cashdya, whose nephew, one Philip Gearry, a notorious rebel, they had feized and sent to Caran, where he was hanged for high treaton.

The Jury took a long time to canfider the safe, and returned a verdict of Guilty against

Thomas Carlon, acquitting the other priloner.
The judge [Kelly] then pronounced fentence of death on Thomas Carlon, directing that the execution should take place on Friday morning at 8 o'clock.

At five o'clock on Friday morning, a brother of the prifoner came to the prifon to fee the unhappy convict, and informed the gaoler that Mr. Wainwright the clergyman would attend in a thort time to pray with and administer the foravery humanely directed that his relations thould have access to the prisoner, to that the brother was permitted to go into the condemned cell to him-in some time after the goafer came to acquaint the brothers that the time was very thort. that his orders for the hour of execution were peremptory, and that if the clergyman was expected they had better fend for him, it being nearly 6 o'clock-the brother offered to go for him, and accordingly did fo. Shorely after Mr. Wainwright came, and being shewn into the cell, continued a long time in prayer with the

Eight o'clock was approaching, when the gaoler came in, accompanied by the priloner's unale. The clergyman then told the prifoner that he had no time to lofe, that his uncle was come to
