

We have great pleasure in assuring the public, that in consequence of the representations to his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, by the Gentlemen of the County of Limerick, of the present disturbed state of the County, his Excellency was graciously pleased, in compliance with their request, to issue such orders for the most vigorous measures to be immediately taken, against all riotous and disorderly persons, as we trust will in a short time, with the assistance of the Magistrates and Gentlemen, effectually restore this County to that tranquillity and subordination to the Law, it has still very lately been distinguished for.

Major-General Sir James Duff, from the present disturbed state of this County, has issued orders that all persons within this County, and the Liberties of Limerick, do post upon their doors a list of the inhabitants belonging to the respective houses; and also directs that no person, on any pretext whatever, be absent from his house between the hours of 9 o'clock at night and sunrise next morning; he has also ordered the Military and Yeomanry to keep constant patrols, for the purpose of taking up such persons as deviate in any degree from this notice.

His Excellency the Marquis Cornwallis and suite, set out from Mount-Shannon yesterday morning for Tullamore, on his way to Dublin.

Wednesday night, a party of armed Rebels broke into the house of John Donoghue, farmer, near Hospital, in this County, and robbed him of 60 guineas, and several other articles.

Last night about the hour of one o'clock, the house of Mr. Jere. Ryan, Paper Manufacturer, at Annacotty, in the Liberties of this city, was broke open and entered by six armed villains, who robbed him of some cash and his arms; we are sorry to add they used him in a most cruel manner, by striking him severely on his head with the butt-end of a blunderbuss.
