LIMERICK.—OCTOBER 18.

On Sunday last, that truly respectable Veteran, Lieutenant General Maffey, Governor of Limerick, set out from his Seat, 121 Elm, in this County, for Dublin, on his way to Bath.

Yesterday morning, at five o'clock, the Inhabitants of the English-town were alarmed by a Drum beating to arms, occasioned by a fire which broke out in an Out-office, belonging to Miss Mansfield, in Dominick-street; providentially the damage done was inconsiderable, the fire having been got under by the exertions of the Military, and neighbouring Gentlemen.

Yesterday, Mr. Riedy, Inspector of Butter, seized a Cask containing above a cwt. weight, for being fraudulently made up, the entire sides of the Cask being filled with grease.—It was condemned by the Worshipful Mayor, and the produce given to the Poor.

The Mail-Coach arrived last night at eleven, for the first time it travelled in 24 hours from Dublin, since the Rebellion.—we may expect the newspapers on the Mail's arrival will be delivered out of our Post-Office to the Coffee-houses and publick Persons, and the letters the next morning at nine, and until three in the afternoon; as also from 8 at night until 10 o'clock, after which four letters will not be delivered at the Limerick Post-Office.

The Mail-Coach was guarded from Kilmahulla to this City, by an escort of Captain Waller's Corps of Owns and Arrah Cavalry, and three of His Majesty's Dragoons.

This day, Michael Lally, Daniel Lally, John Toomey, Geo. Rourke, Paul Rourke, John Tynan, William Rourke, Henry Bankes, Jas. Neale, and Denis Healy, were brought in from Fodamore, by Lieut. Snuddert, and a party of the Clare Regiment, charged with acts of rebellion; they will be brought to trial next week before a General Court-Martial.

Since our last, Eliza Hogan, Mary Barnes, and Kitty Barney, (supposed to be from Carlow) were committed to the City Gaol, by the Right Worshipful Ralph Westropp, Mayor, charged with stealing out of Shops in this City, various articles of Linen-drapsery.
