On Saturday last, the Rev. Mr. Beaufort having
received intelligence that three men, armed with
pistols, had secreted themselves in a hay-rick on
the lands of Ballinlough, near Bruff, he proceeded
with a party of the Royal Suffolk Pencibles to-
wards the place, and after a chase of some miles
across a deep country, apprehended them, not
without a desperate resistance, and lodged them
in the Bridewell of Bruff; they turned out to be
deserters from Honispech's regiment, and were
armed with a case of pistols, and several rounds
of ball cartridge.—One of them attempted sev-
eral times to shoot himself sooner than surrender.
The country people were remarkably willing to
give every information respecting these despera-
tes, a happy proof of their recovery from
delusion.
