To the Printer of the Limerick Chronicle,

I think it a duty I owe myself and the Public,  
to communicate, then the result of your very  
useful Paper, the result of an experiment made  
with the Potatoe Test, commonly called the Scul-  
lance, and that taken out with the new-invented  
Scrap. It is unadvisable in this extravagantly  
dear and scarce season, to preach Fugality,  
every Poor House-keeper has felt, and I am  
afraid will feel more, the necessity of practising  
it; I directed all the poor Potatoes to be, to get  
rid of that rooted attachment to old fashions to  
which the lower classes of this Country are per-  
sicularly addicted. Every person who has Po-  
tatoes to few, has it in his power to save one-fourth  
of what seed has been usually sown by making  
use of this Improvement. I weighed the Scullane  
Seed of an Acre last year, and that taken out of  
the Potatoes by the Scrap and found the difference  
to be, as follows; the ground sown with the Scul-  
lance Seed had many failures, whereas that sown  
with the Scrap had none, and tho' the soil and  
preparation were the same, the most evident dif-  
ference was in the quantity in favour of the  
Scullane. In this experiment I sowed over  
the Scullane test, the large Potatoe was made  
use of, fresh when harvested, a more laborious  
but much lessening the quantity than from the  
small Potatoe which is usually cut & had the  
large Potatoe has the disadvantage of never being  
thoroughly boiled, nor found to dry as the small  
one, which renders it the fitst for food; it is  
impossible to make use of the large Potatoe for  
Scullane seed being too watery. The Scullane  
seed has often 3 or 4 eyes, all of which emirg-  
shoots must be weak in proportion to their num-  
ber, and if a Scullane be cut with only one eye,  
it seldom has a sufficiency of root immediately  
under the eye, which the Scrap set always pos-  
sesses: The remnant of the Potatoe after taking  
from it all the eyes or sets, is as useful as any  
other, either boiled for use, or made into Flour,  
which makes very superior Bread, mixed with  
three parts wheaten, or alone for Pasty or  
Chicken pie. I have not found the Potatoe di-  
vided of its sets to suffer by being so, if it did,  
the greater part might be employed in preparing  
the flour, in order that what remains of the  
Potatoe should be confined both after cutting.
