Admiralty-Office, March 17.

Copy of a letter from Archibald Dickson, Esq; Admiral of the Blue, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated at Yarmouth, the 16th inst.

MR.—Be pleased to acquaint my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty of the arrival of Majesty's sloop Favourite, having brought in her L'Optimiste French schooner privateer, fourteen guns and forty-seven men, which she captured, after a short chase, on the 15th inst. enclose for their Lordships' information, Capt. Westbeach's letter to me on the subject: and am

Favourite at Sea, March 13, 1801.
Sir, I beg leave to request you, that at half past ten yesterday morning, I chased a lugger in under Scarborough, and continued so till 1 P. M. when I lost sight of her; I then saw a boat windward, to which I also gave chase, I captured; she proves to be L'Optimiste French schooner privateer of Dunkirk, (ailed in thence seven days), mounting fourteen carriage guns, manned with forty-seven men, commanded by Jean Baptiste Corenwinder.

Extract of a letter from Lord Viscount Gartes, Captain of his Majesty's Ship the Hussar, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated Cove of Cork, the 11th instant.

In lat. 34. deg. N. long. 25. deg. W. I captured the French schooner privateer and letter of marque Le General Beliere, pierced for fourteen guns, armed with four, and six swivels, and manned with twenty-four men; from Bourdeaux bound to St. Domingo.

His Royal Highness the Earl of Armagh, (Duke of Cumberland) was in the chair, supported by Lord Tara, and Lord Clare.
