"I am therefore directed by his Excellency to desire you will suggest it to the magistrates of your bailiwick to take the proper measures for having the said caution published at the several fairs in their respective neighbourhoods, so that the refusers thereto may be forewarned of the frauds to which they may be liable from the issues of forged notes, and the losses which have of late so frequently fallen upon a class of sufferers, less able to bear them, may in future be prevented.
