

reinforced by two ships of the line from Minorca. This intelligence is corroborated by other advices received by the Marine brig, by whose dispatches it appears, that Gantheaume's Squadron sailed from Toulon on the 17th ult. and put back in the 19th.

5] Yesterday M. Otto received dispatches from the French Government, in consequence of which he had a conference with Lord Hawkebury, Minister for the Foreign Department, to whom he presented an official note renewing the request already made by the First Consul, that the Negotiations for peace should take place in London, and soliciting Passports for the Negotiators nominated to enter upon that business. The required Passports, it is said, are now making out for Citizens Joseph Bonaparte, De Gayot, and Maret.

A Post-Office Express arrived in Town yesterday evening from Leith, where Lieutenant Digby arrived with Dispatches from Sir Hyde Parker; they were forwarded to London by Express.

Our fleet passed the Sound on the 26th ult. with very inconsiderable molestation; and on anchoring off Copenhagen, the Danish Government sent a flag of truce on board the Admiral's ship.

Yesterday after this Paper had been at press some time, we received French Journals up to the 4th inst. inclusive. A letter from Cadiz, of the 13th of March, in the *Moniteur* mentions, but intelligence had been received there from Algiers, of Gen. Abercromby having been defeated in Egypt, with the loss of 10,000 men killed and prisoners; but it is evident from the same, that this story deserves very little notice.

The *Moniteur* likewise states that Sir J. B. Warren's Squadron having been chased into Minorca by that of Gantheaume's, when the latter went to Toulon, Sir John took advantage of that opportunity to put again to sea, and that on the 16th of March he appeared off the mouth of the Bay of Naples, with four ships of the line and two frigates; after being supplied there with provisions, he set sail again on the 17th. The Official Paper says nothing farther of Gantheaume's Squadron, nor is it mentioned whether he had again sailed from Toulon.

The *Moniteur* likewise mentions a report, current at Naples, that Sir Ralph Abercrombie had sailed from Macri on the 22d of February, and on the 1st of March was off Aboukir, at which time no attempt had been made to renew the correspondence which had been formerly carried on with certain persons in the French army.

Government has received advices of one million barrels of flour coming from America. One half of the above is on its passage, and some has already arrived.

On the 27th ult. a fleet of about 18 ships, belonging to Rostock and Lubeck, sailed from Denmark to England with Corn.
