On Monday the 13th inst. the Rev. Mr. Fox, Parish Priest of Mullinahone, in the co. Tipperary, while sitting in his own Parlour, at the hour of one o'clock on said day, was barbarously shot dead by some Villain, as yet undiscovered.—Mr. Fox was distinguished for humanity and loyalty, and his murder is suspected to have been perpetrated by some Rebel whom he had cautioned against treasonable practices.
