LONDON, July 18 & 20.

Hamburgh mail due on Wednesday last, in the course of last night, and has brought with it the notes of the Russian Ambassador to the French Government, the substance of which we laid before our Readers some time since, namely, that Alexander requires the assistance of the King of Sardinia, and the compliance of the King of Naples in his favour. The French do not, however, at the present moment, seem inclined to make many concessions for the gratification of Russia.—Had the Northern league continued in force, a motive of compliance on the part of the Chief Consul at Hamburgh, possibly have been found; for though Russia is at a distance and other causes, can not in a moment attempt or effect any thing injurious to France, yet by the execution of the Northern league, France could promise herself to receive benefits that were worth purchasing.—However, is now ended, and Bonaparte has set himself on new grounds, which very much diminish the value of diplomatic professions or smiles. It is to be regretted, if we may judge by the nature of the intelligence which have this morning reached us, that the event seems placed at some distance. A flag of truce sailed yesterday morning from the coast in an open boat, and returned the following afternoon, bringing back with her the dispatches unopened!
