

Consul has threatened to withdraw his signature if the clauses of the Concordat should be published before it was officially promulgated. There is mention of a general resignation of French Bishops. The Pope takes upon himself the demand that of the old Prelates, and the Consul will oblige the new to conform to the position.

Episcopal Sees will be filled up by persons presented to them by the First Consul, and named by the Pope, as has been done in France before the Revolution. The Curates are appointed by the Bishops and Prefects conjointly.

The Catholic Religion is to be recognized as that of the majority of the French, its adherents to have salaries, and a sanction is to be given to the sale of the Ecclesiastical property. The form of the engagement to be taken is to be the promise of fidelity to the Government of the Republic, as established by the Constitution.

The Jesuits of Spain, who had last year permission to return to their country, have since received counter-orders. The Pope has granted to the Emperor of Russia a new brief which confirms the General and their institution, established throughout the whole of the Empire upon the same footing as they were on before their suppression, notwithstanding any Bull, Brief, &c. to the contrary. They are also restored in some parts of Italy, and in Rome, with a numerous body of noviciates. There are two of them in France; the one at Paris, the other at Ronen. The institution bears the name of the Society of the Faith of Jesus. The Abbe de Glanville is gone to found a seminary of them in England; but we understand that the old Catholics do not acknowledge this establishment, and consider its members as *Basilard Jesuits*.

ENGLAND.

Sept. 30 — Yesterday, at one o'clock, the *Albatross*, Captain Lattimore, sailed for Calais. Mr. Tyrwhitt, the Secretary of Mr. Paget, had been at Dover for six weeks, not having permission to embark, but it came yesterday, and he sailed. The vessel came back about 10 o'clock, and brought seven passengers; they were Colonel Hall, David Lloyd, Capt. Lloyd, and two officers of Marines, and two persons belonging to Manchester, who were not prisoners, but they not complying, the two last are ordered to be sent back to Calais; the former gentlemen were passengers in the *Swiss*, and were taken on her passage home.

Oct. 1. — Sailed the *Amazon* frigate, Admiral Nelson; Express advice boat, and gun-vessels on a cruise.

Sept. 23. — Captain Glyn, late Surgeon, of 18 guns, arrived yesterday, under the command of the *Ameryst*, of 38 guns. Capt. Cook, absent with leave. The *Amber* sailed on Thursday, and put back on Friday by order.
