The Libel, in the first case, being fully sup-  
 ported, and the testimony being perfectly satis-

 to the greater Excommunication for causing the  
 Marriage to be solemnized under such circum-  
 stances, and to be separated from such illegal  
 marriage; to do Penance at the discretion of the  
 Court for the Perjury, and to pay such Costs as  
 should be decreed.

While the parties remain under this sentence  
 of Excommunication, they are not capable of  
 suing at Law for any Debt; their Oath cannot  
 be admitted in any Court of Justice; they can-  
 not make a Will; and if they remain under this  
 sentence for 40 days, on an application to the  
 King in Chancery, a Writ is issued to the Sher-  
 riffs to commit the offenders to the common Jail,  
 till satisfaction be made to the Ecclesiastical Power,  
 and all Costs be paid.—The second Cause is still  
 before the Court.
