

We are happy to announce the *Cyathia*, a Hoop of war, driven by the storm announced in our Gazette, mentioned in the first page of this paper, was safe on the evening of the 24th inst. without any other damage than that of her launch.

The English ship *Lionel*, from St. John's, New Brunswick, lately returned after full sail, on her passage to Jamaica, the only person saved was a Negro, who floated on one of the hatchways for four days, without any food whatever, and was at length drifted on shore near Cape Raphael, in St. Domingo.

His Majesty's ship *Aurora*, Cap. Wilson, on Monday arrived at Spitzbergen, from Newfoundland, left from Lisbon, after a passage of 16 days from the latter place. During the whole of the passage she experienced a succession of gales of wind and bad weather. In the Tagus, his Majesty's ship *Albatross*, of 18 guns, Cap. Provoost. His Majesty's ship *Cathie*, Cap. Wright; failed from the Tagus for Gibraltar, on the 16th Dec. On the 25th Dec. the *Aurora* spoke the *Stanley*, of London, in lat. 42 deg. 37 min. and long. 15 deg. 20 min. W. bound to the island of Nova, and 14 days from the Downs, all well.—As the *Aurora* was going to off Balem Castle, near Lisbon, a shot was fired from the Castle, which knocked away one of her hammock stanchions of the fore-cabin and through the hammocks, and nearly killed two or three of the people. The shot was immediately dismissed, and an order, that no shot be fired at an English man of war, is given.

DUBLIN, JANUARY 20.

It is but a few days since we mentioned the robbery of the Derry mail coach near Droghda, and we have this day to narrate an attack, however more happily resulted, made yesterday at 10 o'clock in the morning on the Limerick mail coach near the town of Kildare, which consisted of a discharge of fire-arms from the hedges, followed by an open attack; the guard, mindful of his duty, fired among them and brought two of them to the ground, which so terrified the rest of the wicked gang, that they fled without further attempt. One of the horses was badly wounded, but no other mischief occurred.—*Hib. Jour.*
