**LIMERICK, MAY 18.**

On Wednesday at noon, Charles Silver Oliver, Esq; Member for the County of Limerick, went to Woolwich Warren, accompanied by Captain Oliver of the Navy, and some other Gentlemen, and two of the Bow-street Officers, having information that a man of the name of Dwyer, who had been convicted of a horrid murder of both father and son, in the County of Limerick, more than two years since, and who had made his escape from Limerick jail, was employed as a labourer in the Warren. Mr. Oliver, in disguise, watched at the Gate of the Warren, and, as the men were coming out to dinner, seized Dwyer by the collar, and gave him in charge to the Bow-street Officers.—*From the London Star of the 14th inst.*
