CAPITULATION.

The King of England having refused to ratify

d. In consequence Lieutenant-Gen. Mortier,
ander in Chief of the French army, and his
ncy Count de Walmoden, Commander in
of the Hanoverian army, have agreed on
lowing capitulation, which must be immedi-
cuted, without being of such a nature, as
ubmitted to the ratification of the two Co-
ents:

I. The Hanoverian army shall lay down
ms, which with all their artillery shall be
d up to the French army.

II. All the horses of the Hanoverian Cavalry,
the of the artillery, shall be delivered up to
rea army by one of the Members of the
e. A Commission nominated by the Comman-
in Chief shall be immediately sent to make out
t and a removal of them.

III. The Hanoverian army shall be disbanded,
troops shall pass the Elbe, and retire to their
es, having previously engaged on their word of
or not to carry arms against France and its allies
il they shall be exchanged on equal terms,
as many French soldiers, as may be taken by
gland in the course of the war.

IV. The Hanoverian Generals and Officers shall
re on their parole, such places as they may
ose for their residence, provided they do not

conduct."
