Letter from Carlisle, speaking of Hatfield's
conduct, says, that during the course of it he repeatedly
was called upon for his defence,
and for a few minutes with great coolness, and
with the conduct of several very respectable
gentlemen. On Tuesday last, he was called
upon at breakfast, to receive the awful sentence of
the law, which was preceded by a most impressive
address from the Judge, who assured him, there
was no hopes of mercy for him here, and there-
fore he must prepare to answer for his crimes before
the great Disposer of all human events. This did
not seem to affect him, as he returned to his cell,
and finished his breakfast. We are informed, how-
ever, that he seems resigned to his fate;—and it is
to be hoped, that he will make good use of
the short time he has to live, and strive to make his
peace with an offended God. The Jury recom-
mended Hatfield to mercy; but we are informed,
that he was left for execution, on Saturday the 3d
of September. The place of execution is on a
small island where two rivers join, near Carlisle.
He was dressed in sack; and on being arraigned,
he refused to plead, unless his irons were taken off;
and on the Judge interfering, he submitted;—and
his irons were taken off during the trial.
