LIMERICK, SEPTEMBER 21.

The trial of Robert Emmett, commenced on Monday morning last, at 9 o'clock, at the Sessions-House, in Green-street, Dublin; it held until 9 at night, when he was capitally convicted, and sentenced to be executed next day: during the Trial, the entire of the Londonderry Militia, with another regt. of Infantry, and two Troops of Cavalry, were on duty in Green-street.—On sentence being passed on Emmett, he fully admitted the justice thereof.

The vigilance and attention of the Magistrates in this City as well as the neighbouring Counties, are truly praiseworthy, for apprehending suspected Persons, who at this most critical period are found without passes or protection;—since our last publication, two men have been committed to the New Gaol, one from the Co. of Clare, the other by our active City Sheriffs.
