To inform my Lords Commissioners of War, that we this day fell in with and captured, for England, the Dutch States Schooner Capt. Lieut. J. Ysorands, Commanded by 12 guns and 33 men, from the Cape of Good Hope, after thirty hours, with dispatches for France, which she threw overboard, having obliged us to let our boats on board before he would let our boats on board. We seized 18 twelve-pounder caronades, and caused to leave them at the Cape. &c.
