### LIMERICK, NOVEMBER 26.

The following *General Orders* dated the 23d inst. signed by Henry Harding, Esq; Yeomanry Brigade Major, has been received by the Commandant of the Brigade of Yeomanry of this City:

“I have to acquaint you, that pursuant to a General Order, the Yeomanry Corps of this City, under your Command, now on Permanent Duty, are to discontinue from the 24th inst. Permanent Duty, and revert to two days Exercise and Pay in the week, until further Orders.”

Similar Orders have, we hear, been sent to all the Yeomanry Corps in the neighbouring Counties, and we believe it to be general through this Kingdom; a proof positive how little our Government fear from the threats of the gasconading *Bonaparte!*
