Parliament did not adjourn for the Holidays yellerday, as was intended. The Bill for correcting the Abuses in the Naval Department has paffed the Lords, but as some amendments have been made to it by their Lordships, however trifling thefe may be, it is necessary that they receive the fanction of the House of Commons, for which purpose they are to be taken into confideration en Monday. Both Houses will adjourn on Tuefday or Wednelday at fartheft.

By the Dutch Mail we learn, that on the 13th of December a body of Danish troops unexpecredly rook possession of the villages, which, by the plan of indemnities, had been affigned to the free city of Lubeck. The motives forthis caexpetted proceeding are not announced.

The earthquake, ou the 26th of Oft, feeme to have done more mischief in Transyltania than was at firft believed. In one diffriet all the free-Der were deftroyed, and more than fixty people were buried under the ruins of their houses in ene village.

Dec. 26.]-Yesterday the remainder of the letters brought from Malta, &c. by the Thames, were delivered from the Post-Office, Our letters from La Valette are dated the 23d of Sept. at which period the Neapolitan troops, deflined to garrifon the ifland, had arrived there.

The Emperor of Ruffit, it is ftared, har, at

length, accepted the guarantee of Melta. Yesterday we received by the Dutch Mail a letter from Constantinople, dated the 10th of November, by which we learn, that meafures have been taken to malife the advantages expected to refult to this country, from the navigation of the Black Sea.

Letters by the fame Mail affers the British Ambasfador at Paris had remonfrated to the Confular Government on the fubiect of the continuance of the French troops in Holland .-The refult of this measure is not mentioned, but it appears to have been unfuccelsful, as fresh troops daily enter the country. The Dutch Government has succeeded in preventing the effablifment of French garrifons at the Hague, &c. the head-quarters of this auxiliary army is fixed
