BERLIN, Dec. 18.—Their Majesties, with the
King's brothers and all their suite, are arrived
here to-day from Potsdam.
Yesterday arrived a Dutch messenger, who
brought the exchanged ratification of the Con-
vention between our Coast and the Batavian Re-
public, respecting Sevenser, Hovffen, and Mal-
burg, and was immediately dispatched on his
business being ended. A courier from Baden
has passed through to-day, on his way to St. Pe-
tersburgh.

PARIS, December 24.—On Sunday the 12th
a Deputation from the Republic of the Valsai was
presented to the First Consul. It consisted of
Anthony Augustini, Grand Bailiff of the Republic,
James Quarterly, Vice-Councillor of State, and
Peter Joseph de Rudmatten, Ex-President of Tri-
bunal.

The Grand-Bailiff addressing the First Consul
said, "In this honourable moment we are the
organs of all the hearts of the Valsaians, none of
whom are strangers to the gratitude we owe to
you—we are charged to convey to you the homage
of their gratitude. To give to this public act of
gratitude all the solemnity possible, they have
sent their Chief himself at the head of this
Deputation."

When the Grand Bailiff had finished his speech
he presented to the First Consul a law of the
Valsaien Diet, in the following terms:—

REPUBLIC OF THE VALSAI.
The Diet of the Republic, on a confidential
proposal of the Council of State, considering
that it is the first Diet which has assembled, in
virtue of the Treaties and Constitution, which
have restored to the Valsaians their independence,
&c. &c. declares:

Art. I. Bonaparte, First Consul of the French
Republic, and President of the Italian Republic,
is proclaimed in name of the Valsaien people,
restorer of the independence of the Republic of
the Valsai.

II. The homage of the present law shall be
conveyed to him by a special Deputation.

III. The present law shall be printed, pub-
lished, and passed up every year on the 5th of
September, the anniversary of the proclamation
of the independence of the Valsai.

Done in Diet at Sion, Oct. 28, 1802.

LONDON, December 26, &c.

LIMERICK, JANUARY 3.

Sunday evening, a young Boy fell out of a boat
into the River, at the Custom-house-quay, but
was providentially rescued from Death by a spi-
rited sailor plunging to his assistance.

Sunday night, some trifling dispute arose be-
tween Mr. John Mealy, of Anacotty, and his
Brother-in-Law, Mr. John Kirby, of Scart (both
in the South Liberties of Limerick), at the house
of the latter, when Kirby took up a musket,
loaded with flour, the contents of which he dis-
charged into Mealy's right face, of which wound
he died next day.—Yesterday the Right Wor-
shipful Mayor, as Coroner of this City, held an
Inquest on the Body of the deceased, whose
Verdict was, Willful Murder, against said John
Kirby.

On Monday morning about three o'clock, a
number of wretches, attacked the house of Mr.
William Benson, of Greenhill in this County,—
(whose windows and furniture were destroyed on
Sunday night the 26th ult. by a similar armed
party)—on knocking at the door, they demanded
entrance, and to give up whatever Sadles, Bri-
dles and Arms were in the house; Benson's Son
who first got out of bed, replied there were none
of the former in the house, that they would not
part with their Arms, and cautioned the villains
against entering.—After the lapse of a few mi-
nutes, some of the party returned with a lighted
Turf, got from a neighbouring Cabin, which
they were in the act of putting under the Thatch,
which being observed by the elder Benson, he
fired a large Pistol among them, loaded with
flugs, by which one of the gang was killed on
the spot, and it is said two others are dangerously
wounded, the rest fled.—The Man who received
this unexpected death proves to be Daniel Ryan
a labourer, who resided near Balliford.—The
