was incrusted with a thick coat of ice : the doors and windows were closed up, and in order to gain admission, it was necessary, with bammers and hatchets, to open a paffage; they were obliged to cut through the ice another flair-cale, for the purpose of ascending to the upper stories. All the rooms, and what remained of the roof, were embellished by long stalactites, of multifa-rious shapes, and of a yellowish colour, composed of the treacle and congealed water.

"This building, contemplated in the light of the fun, feem to bear fome analogy to those diaof poets. It remained upwards of two months in the fame flate, and was vifited by all the curious. The children, in particular, had excellent amusement with it, and contributed not a little to the deftruction of the enchanted palace, by fearthing for the particles of fugar, which were found in many places incorporated with the ice."

Advices have been received of the lofs of the Duke of Clarence, of Plymouth, Capt. Faulkner, bound from Quebec to London, laden with wheat. She failed on the 23d September, and three days after was wrecked in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, in a very violent gale of wind: the skip and cargo were totally lost, and Captain Faulkner, with his Chief Mate and three seamen, as also Mr. Elliott, of Plymouth, part owner of the ship, and his fen, a lad about fourteen years old, were drowned; the Second Mate, and 3 feamen, were faved.
