... the fortifications of that city shall remain as they are, and no new works be erected.

The Emperor of Germany in return for the conditions obtained for the Grand Duke, binds himself to procure the consent of the Empire to the arrangements concerted by the mediating powers.

The First Consul engages to unite his influence with that of the Emperor of Russia to procure for the Grand Duke and his heirs the Electoral Dignity.

The Convention is to be ratified within twenty days, or sooner, if possible. It is signed by Count Cobenzel, Joseph Bonaparte, and Count Marlow, the Russian Minister.

It is reported on the Continent that, beside this public Convention, secret articles have been entered into upon various other points. It is observed, in confirmation of this opinion, that the new Convention trenches upon the arrangements made in favour of the Elector of Bavaria, without assigning him any reparation whatever. It is said, that Austria has formerly agreed to the erection of Tuscany into a Kingdom, to the extension of the French boundaries in Italy, to the annexation of Parma and Piacenza, and to the interference of France in the affairs of Switzerland, though contrary to the treaty of Lunéville. It is certain at least that these objects have given rise to discussion; and it is probable that some Convention will be concluded, to sanction and acknowledge what has been done.

Feb. 3.]—Last night, a little before 12 o'clock a most alarming fire broke out at Mr. Hamilton's Printing Office, at the top of Falcon-Court. The private house of Mr. H. as well as his valuable Printing Office, are entirely destroyed, and the 3 adjoining houses materially injured. The property lost is estimated at near 11,000l. not above 3000l. of which was injured. We are happy, however, to find that no lives have been lost.

Feb. 4.]—Yesterday Lord Hawkesbury gave notice to the House of Commons, of the intention of Ministers to move for the renewal of the bill forbidding payments in specie by the Bank. We are not surprised that the continuance of this measure should be found necessary; but those who the most ardently supported it last spring, when it passed, must now find their predictions woefully fulfilled. We were then assured, that no doubt could be entertained of the capacity of the Bank to renew its payments in specie on the 1st of March, 1803, and to sanguine were some on the subject, they expected the Bank would be able to resume its payments even before that period. In consequence a power was inserted in the bill to enable the Bank to make payments before the expiration of the restriction.

DUBLIN, FEBRUARY 7.
