He will take post in the vicinity of Messina, in order to defend the narrow pas between the Scylla and Charibdia of the Ancients, and a British squadron is kept cruizing in the Straits of Mellina, and on the Northern Coasts of the Island.

Accounts have been received by a vessel arrived at Hull from Hamburgh, that a body of French troops took possession of Bremen on the 2d instant. The accounts add that another column was marching for Hamburgh. The first part of this intelligence will probably be confirmed, but Pruffia can hardly be expected to allow the French to take poffession of Hamburgh. No accounts have been received this day from the Continent to enable us to contradict or confirm these statements. We are convinced that as the French pay little regard either to the faith of Treaties or to the rights of Neutrality, they will endeavour to occupy every port in the North of Germany, in order to embarrafs our commerce, unless prevented by the interference of Pruffia and Ruffia. As fuch a measure would be a great detriment to the trade of these powers, and particularly that of the former, we ftill entertain hopes that they will not be fo blind to their own interests as to remain tame spectators of fuch a violation of justice.

We understand that the plan for the Defence of the Country is nearly completed, and will soon be laid before Parliament. We hope it will be adequate to its purpose, and we have but little doubt of its receiving the hearty support of the whole empire.
