RAMSGATZ, Nov. 8 .- " By an officer who was prefent in the late attack made on the French gun boats at Boulogne, we have been favoured with the following particulars: The British force, confishing of the Raitonable, of 64 guns, the Leda and Immortalite frigates, the Archer and Locust gun brigs, and the Counters of Elgin armed cutter, went into Boulogne Bay on Sunday last at slood tide, and passed the batteries, under which 84 gun boats each carrying a 24 pounder were moored together, with fprings on their cables, and, prefenting their bows, formed a most formidable battery. In this situation our ships passed the line of boats four times, fuccessively keeping up a continued and well directed fire, which according to every appearance did confiderable damage to their masts and rigging. The firing on both sides was most tremendous. The gun boats were powerfully supported by the immenfe batteries of guns and mortars which have been constructed in the most advantageous positions on the coast, many of the shot and shells from which paffed over our veffels in every direction .-The greater part of them went a great way beyond our fquadron; fuch of them as took effect fell among the rigging; few of them struck the hulls of our vessels, and notwithstanding the prodigious number fired, few of the men were injured by them. " The Immortalite was the principal fufferer,

having had her foremalt shot away, and several men killed and wounded. This feems to be the principal lofs on our fide. In regard to the lofs of the enemy, it cannot yet be ascertained; but there is reason to think that it must have been considerable, as their boats were exposed to the fire of our fquadron, which was maiatained with great spirit and energy."

## LONDON, NOVEMBER 9 & 10.

A report was circulated yesterday at the Stock Exchange before the close of the market, that the Brest fleet had put to sea. It received but little credit; and we can affert that no fuch intelligence

has yet reached the Admiralty.

We understand that the last accounts received by Government respecting the present force at Brest, stated, that there were in that harbour fourteen thips of war, confifting of line of battle thips and cut-down vessels. They were ready for fea, but were manned not for fighting, but merely for the purposes of speedy navigation. There were belides, transports sufficient for the conveyance of twentyfive thousand men.

Befides the force under Admiral Cornwallis, feveral ships of the line are stationed at Bantry Bay, to be ready to oppose any attempt of the enemy to make a descent on Ireland. They are victualled for two months, and provisions will be fent to them from time to time, to prevent the necessity of their

quitting their station.

We have to announce that the reward which Bonaparte promifed to the first of his myrmidons who should fet foot on British ground, may now be claimed, as no less than about thirty French foldiers, and four failors with their gun-boat, are now in that predicament.
