RAMSGATE, Nov. 8.—"By an officer who was
... present in the late attack made on the French gun
... boats at Boulogne, we have been favoured with the
... following particulars: The British force, consisting
... of the *Raisonable*, of 64 guns, the *Leda* and *Im-
... mortale* frigates, the *Archer* and *Locust* gun brigs,
... and the *Countess* of Elgin armed cutter, went into
... Boulogne Bay on Sunday last at flood tide, and
... passed the batteries, under which 84 gun boats each
... carrying a 24 pounder were moored together, with
... springs on their cables, and, presenting their bows,
... formed a most formidable battery. In this situa-
... tion our ships passed the line of boats four times,
... successively keeping up a continued and well directed
... fire, which according to every appearance did con-
... siderable damage to their masts and rigging. The
... firing on both sides was most tremendous. The
... gun boats were powerfully supported by the im-
... mense batteries of guns and mortars which have
... been constructed in the most advantageous positions
... on the coast, many of the shot and shells from
... which passed over our vessels in every direction.—
... The greater part of them went a great way beyond
... our squadron; such of them as took effect fell
... among the rigging; few of them struck the hulls
... of our vessels, and notwithstanding the prodigious
... number fired, few of the men were injured by them.
... "The *Immortale* was the principal sufferer,
... having had her foremast shot away, and several
... men killed and wounded. This seems to be the
... principal loss on our side. In regard to the loss of
... the enemy, it cannot yet be ascertained; but there
... is reason to think that it must have been consi-
... derable, as their boats were exposed to the fire of our
... squadron, which was maintained with great spirit
... and energy."

LONDON, NOVEMBER 9 & 10.

This day a Mail arrived from Lisbon. By this
... conveyance we have received letters from Lisbon,
... Malaga, Cadiz, and Gibraltar.

A French sloop of war, the *Hatcyon*, has been
... captured by Lord Nelson. This fleet under his
... Lordship was all well on the 2d of October, off
... Toulon.

A report was circulated yesterday at the Stock
... Exchange before the close of the market, that the
... British fleet had put to sea. It received but little
... credit; and we can assure that no such intelligence
... has yet reached the Admiralty.

We understand that the last accounts received by
... Government respecting the present force at Brest,
... stated, that there were in that harbour fourteen
... ships of war, consisting of line of battle ships and
... cut-down vessels. They were ready for sea, but
... were manned not for fighting, but merely for the
... purposes of speedy navigation. There were besides,
... transports sufficient for the conveyance of twenty-
... five thousand men.

Besides the force under Admiral Cornwallis, fe-
... veral ships of the line are stationed at Bantary Bay,
... to be ready to oppose any attempt of the enemy
... to make a descent on Ireland. They are victualled
... for two months, and provisions will be sent to them
... from time to time, to prevent the necessity of their
... quitting their station.

We have to announce that the reward which
... Bonaparte promised to the first of his myrmidons
... who should set foot on British ground, may now
... be claimed, as no less than about thirty French
... soldiers, and four sailors with their gun-boat, are
... now in that predicament.

We have received Paris Journals to the 30th ult.
... —No mention is made in these Journals of the
... French Consul having quitted Paris so late as the 29th ult.
... —The following letter, and the preceding extracts,
... are the only articles worthy of notice in the papers
