We hear an application has been made to the
Post-Masters General, from several respectable Gen-

Last Monday, John Farrell, who had been lately
tried by a General Court Martial, and found guilty
on the clearest evidence, of having attacked with
fire arms, &c. the Concerns of Wm. Childerhouse,
on the lands of Newtown, near Patrick's-Well, in
this County, on the night of 6th Jan. last, at which
time he was apprehended; was taken from the
County Gaol under an escort of Yeomanry Ca-
valry, consisting of the following Corps:—Capt.
Fitz-Gibbon's Limerick Volunteers, Capt. Mally's
Royal Limerick, and Captain Furnell's Munster
Rangers, which were afterwards joined by Capt.
Tuthill's Co. Limerick Corps—to Ballybromell, in
the vicinity of Patrick's-Well, where the sentence
of the law was executed.—When going to be hung,
and at the place of execution, he confessed by the
most solemn declaration the justice of his sentence,
behaved in a manner the most penitent and proper,
and gave advice to the surrounding multitude to de-
ter them from such irregularities, as would lead to an
exit so untimely and unfortunate, and of which he
was a melancholy example.

dropped down suddenly and expired, in a house
Mary-street, having gone there only a few minutes
before for refreshment, and conversing cheerfully
with his friends.
