DUBLIN, MARCH 15.

By Express.—From the Dublin Evening Post.
Arrest of Gen. Pichegru.—Although the London
papers received this day, are silent as to such a fact,
our private correspondent, who is possessed of the
first sources of information, states that General
Pichegru was in Paris, and is arrested by the
French Government. This circumstance would
seem to establish the truth of a conspiracy against
Bonaparte, but, if Moreau was concerned in it,
it also proves that it must have had the concurrence
of some of the best men in France, and of those
who had rendered it the greatest service.

His Excellency held a Privy Council at the
Castle, on Tuesday, when amongst other business
transacted, a proclamation was directed to be issued
taking off quarantine from vessels coming from
Malaga, &c. the fever having ceased for some time
past in that quarter.

Tuesday afternoon, Charles Frazer Frizell, Esq;
