An express was also received same evening, with an account of an important victory in India gained by General Lake over the troops of Scindia; after which a Cessation of Hostilities was agreed upon between that Chief and General Wellesley.

The Ceylon Gazette pays a high compliment to Major William Vincent, of the 19th Regt. of Foot, (brother to the present Worshipful Mayor of Limerick) "through whose active and judicious measures, the district where he commanded, was entirely cleared of the enemy."
