Mr. John Connel, the Midshipman who we men-  
 tioned as having been hurt by a trip against the  
 broken foot-way at Newtown-Pery, unfortunately  
 died of a locked-jaw, on Sunday last. We regret  
 to find his death was in a great measure attributa-  
 ble to his not permitting the professional Person  
 who attended him, to amputate the Thumb, imme-  
 diately after the accident, when it was absolutely  
 necessary; and although he had been repeatedly  
 told the fatal effects which otherwise must inevita-  
 bly follow;—the operation did not take place until  
 late on Saturday evening.

Last Sunday Mr. Richard Rowleigh, of Lough-
