### LIMERICK, AUGUST 25.

Wednesday last the Lord Mayor, Sheriffs and Commons of Dublin, waited upon Mr. Foster, First Lord of the Treasury and Chancellor of the Exchequer for Ireland, with the Address of Congratulation voted at their last Quarter Assembly, upon the appointment of that Gentleman to those very high and important Offices. They were received by Mr. Foster with all that affection which has long subsisted ; and received an answer of the warmest gratitude to their very handsome and complimentary Address.--Thursday, the Guild of Merchants waited upon Mr. Foster, for a similar purpose.

Thursday morning the Mail Coach for Dublin, ran over a little Girl, at Faha-Pound, near Kilmastulla, who was killed on the spot.

Yesterday an unfortunate event occurred, in consequence of a Dragoon riding a restive Horse thro' John's-street, which coming in contact with a Car near the Potatoe Market, got entangled, and with its Rider was thrown. The Horse endeavouring to extricate itself, kicked and bruised a poor aged Woman named Catherine Supple, who happened to be near the place, in such a manner, that she died almost immediately after. The Rt. Worshipful Arthur Vincen, Esq; Mayor, as Coroner, had an Inquest holden on the Body, and the Jury brought in a Verdict *Accidental Death*.
