On Sunday last, Mr. Courtenay, son to the late
Lord Bishop of Exeter, and cousin to the Right
Hon. Lord Viscount Courtenay, arrived from Lon-
don, *via* Dublin, at Newcastle, in this County; as
none of the Courtenay Family have been in this
Country, or visited that extensive Estate for more
than two centuries past, it was not to be wonder-
ed, that the most lively sensations were raised in
the breasts of the numerous and respectable Tenan-
try,—the consequence was, that he was met on the
road, and his Carriage drawn in by the Populace
to the Castle, the residence of Mr. Locke; at
night the town was brilliantly illuminated, a very
large bonfire erected in the Square, the Yeomanry
and Inhabitants firing musquetry,—and uninterrup-
ted mirth and jollity kept up till the dawn of the
ensuing day.
