LIMERICK, OCTOBER 13.

On Thursday last, arrived at Tarbert, his Ma-
jesty's Ship Topaze, of 36 guns, Captain Lake,
with Stores for his Majesty's Ship Gorgon.

The Hibernia, Barry, of and for this Port,
from Norway, put into Cove, on Sunday last.

The George, Purcell, from hence to Dublin,
put into the Clyde on the 3d instant.
