On Monday last, died, Mr. James Mealy, of the Spittal; the Mayor held an Inquest on his Body, whose verdict was, that he died in consequence of a mortal wound received in the head on the 14th of January last, from Thomas and John Shaughnessy, who are now confined in the City Jail.
