**TENNANT CARTHY,** of Kilmurry, in the  
parishes of Limerick, who is charged with  
murders, is now in Limerick Gaol. Any

has been robbed on the high way, in this  
county, are desired to call on the Mayor,

A young woman named Margaret Bre-  
nahan, who is supposed to be disordered in her mind, threw
