Comprehensions for the safety of the British Hanover are considerably increased. — Ordinary regret we are obliged to entertain of the immediate entrance of the army into the Electorate, so very superior to render all resistance unavailing. — The division under the command of Anspach nearly the whole of the troops in the Grand Army, might be spared for the service of Hanover, and when joined to those on the frontiers of Holland, by Prince George would form a force little short of one hundred thousand men. The Hanoverian and our native regiments, do not amount to more than a thousand, and the Russians and Swedes in that quarter, are not much more numerous. There is consequently no hope of our being able to retain possession of Hanover. — That Bonaparte, by leaving a garrison in the town, yielded merely to the sudden exigencies of the war, with the determination of recovering the territory, which he considered as a necessary evil in giving up Malta. He will pay as much as to the neutrality of Prussia, or of the Northern States contiguous, as he did Anspach, when he flanked the Austrians. With tremulous anxiety we await the next arrivals from the Continent, as in our duty our fears for the safety of our country must in a great measure be governed
