LIMERICK, JANUARY 21, 1806.

With most bitter sensations we proceed to dis-
charge the melancholy duty of stating, that last
night Robert Westron, Esq. Captain in his Ma-
jesty's 53d Regiment, quartered here, cut his
throat with a razor, literally from ear to ear.—
The repulsive catastrophe is lamentably aggrava-
ted by the consideration of the unfortunate Gen-
tleman having borne an eminent character.—His
heart was known to beat feelingly alive to the calls
of friendship and humanity. His demeanor usual-
ly appeared serious, composed, and reflecting.
Within these few days he complained of a violent
pain in his head, and betrayed slight symp-
toms of despondency. In the evening he remain-
ed at the mess, as usual, for a reasonable time,
and appeared perfectly collected. After retiring
to his chamber, he went to his room, and in the absence
of his servant perpetrated the rash act. The ser-
vant on returning found him on the floor, with the
razor still in his right hand, of which he instantly
acquainted all the Officers. This day the Right
Worshipful Wm. Fosbery, Esq. Mayor, held an
inquest on the body. Verdict—Eunacy.

thropic assertion—"There is nothing in this
world worth living for," but let it be opposed by
that rational question—"What is there worth
dying for?" and it stands stamped with infamy
and detestation. The man who terminates his life
