For my part, I am of opinion, that it is, nevertheless, consistent with sound policy to continue the blokade, in order to leave no opening for the export of Prussian produce.—The dissatistaction in that country, particularly in Silesia, where the linen trade is at a complete stand, is general, and in a twelvemonth would produce every effect that could be wished for. I sincerely hope Administration will not waver in the steps it has adopted, but continue them with firmness and vigour. In Bourdeaux the merchants are oliged to resume their exercise as at the height of the revolution. I am much mistaken if a few months do not bring about ical changes there."

COURT OF KING'S BENEH, LONDON, MAY 16. Female Jealousy.
